Solution? **Nvey Eco**, a natural makeup range that ditches parabens, petrochemicals and synthetic fragrances in favour of botanical extracts and antioxidants. Don't expect amazing colours — just pretty, neutral shades in the usual tasteful spectrum such as beige, bone and browny pinks (1800 245 412).

Other new plant-based pure-mineral makeup on our radar: the five just-released sublime summer colour lipsticks, \$39 each, from i.d. Bare Escentuals, (02) 8307 3614; and ore-inspired eye shimmers from Jane Iredale (1300 850 008).

Va-va-va-volume

Ditch your flat middle-part hippie-inspired hairdo. Rife on the runways at Anna Sui and Missoni, the old-school body wave bounced back with a vengeance. Celebrity fans Angelina Jolie, Gisele and Jennifer Lopez can also be credited for its revival. Hot rollers are a great temporary styling option but for a permanent result, salons are seeing a resurgence in body waves. "[The] process is similar to the old perm — ie, it's a two-part process — but the technique is different," explains Diane Gorgievski of Phillip Gallo Hair, East Sydney, (02) 9360 1192. "We're using a different type of roller to create waves rather than curls. A body wave won't make your hair curly, but it will give it volume." Results last approximately six months and costs vary from \$90 to \$160.
